For sixty years Elizabeth II has met each of her twelve Prime Ministers in a weekly audience at Buckingham Palace—a meeting like no other in British public life. Both parties have an unspoken agreement never to repeat what is said. Not even to their spouses. The Audience breaks this contract of silence and imagines a series of pivotal meetings between the Downing Street incumbents and their Queen. From Churchill to Cameron, each Prime Minister has used these private conversations as a sounding board and a confessional—sometimes intimate, sometimes explosive. In turn, the Queen can't help but reveal her own self as she advises consoles and, on occasion, teases.

HISTORY OF THE LOOKING GLASS PLAYHOUSE

In 1972, a small group of volunteers in Lebanon came together to raise money for McKendree College by producing a musical play. The success of "Fiddler on the Roof," encouraged them to pursue their dream of forming a community theater. They named their organization the Looking Glass Playhouse (LGP), after the Looking Glass Prairie near Lebanon cited by Charles Dickens in his 1842 travelogue, "American Notes for General Circulation." In 1973, members of the fledgling group pooled their money in order to pay their \$25.00 incorporation fee.

The next challenge was finding a home for the newly formed group. The Arcade Theater in downtown Lebanon had been empty for several years and the players rented it for \$50.00/month, with payment due 1 month after their first show premiered. On the "Great Labor Day Clean-Up," volunteers scrubbed away layers of grime and prepared the theater for their first production, "Babes in Toyland." In 1974, the LGP enlarged the stage area, added wings, and converted a first floor apartment into a concession area. Much to the relief of audience members, the apartment bathroom was now available as a restroom and a second toilet was added in a closet. No longer did theater-goers have to descend the treacherous narrow stairs to the basement. In 1979, the group, under the leadership of president Bill Best, sold their first formal season ticket subscriptions. "Man of La Mancha" was the opening show of that season and it heralded a new maturity and stability for the group.

On November 22, 1980, the Playhouse celebrated the purchase of the building and in 1981, renovation began in earnest. Improvements included a 40 foot addition to the back of the building, a new ceiling and roof, a new light booth, and a new stairway leading from the stage to the basement. These improvements marked the first time that cast and crew were able to reach the other side of the stage directly rather than walking through the auditorium or running outside through a lot behind the building. Many of the early "war stories" of the theater included references to these challenges, including the infamous, "Snowboat" episode in which female cast members in hoop skirts and galoshes gamely ran through foot-high snow drifts behind the theater when they had to make an entrance on the opposite side of the stage. 2002 marked the beginning of a second wave of remodeling projects which included renovation of the auditorium, lobby, restrooms, the costume room, the make-up area and modernization of lighting and sound equipment.

The founders of the Looking Glass Playhouse had a dream of bringing performing arts to our community. The volunteers, musicians, actors, crews, and audiences throughout the years have kept that dream alive. Not only does the Playhouse provide a lively season of new and traditional first-run shows, it also provides scholarships, classes and innovative drama experiences such as our Haunted Happenings story telling tour and our annual production of "A Christmas Carol." As a result, the LGP has grown and prospered and is now considered one of the premier community theaters in Illinois.

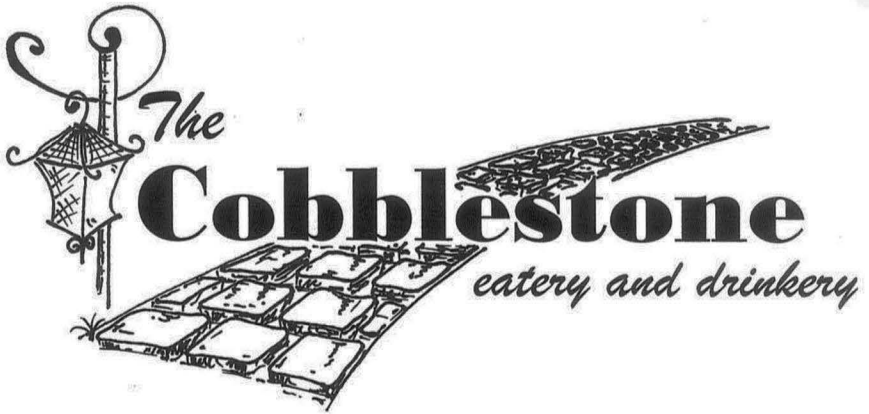
